Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE)

There is no charge to officers or agencies for this training. It is funded through state and federal grants.

Time: .5 day (4 hours)

Class Size: 75-100 students per class

Prerequisite: Sworn law enforcement officer

Required Equipment: Good attitude, open mind, pen and paper

Participants are responsible for their own transportation and lodging.

Schools, businesses, and community members frequently request direction and presentations on what they should do if confronted with an active shooter event. The Civilian Response to Active Shooter Events (CRASE) course, designed and built on the Avoid, Deny, Defend (ADD) strategy developed by ALERT in 2004, provides strategies, guidance and a proven plan for surviving an active shooter event. Topics include:

- history and prevalence of active shooter events
- civilian response options
- medical issues
- considerations for conducting drills

Participants in this four (4) hour Train-the-Trainer course will receive a manual and PowerPoint presentation suitable for use in their own presentations.
